

## ALL THE HAPPY THINGS – CONTENT INFORMATION

**Bereavement:** The play centres around the death of Emily, Sienna's sister. It does not discuss how she died, rather beginning after her death and dealing with the experience of still imagining someone dead is still with you and having to accept that person is in fact gone. Also mention of the imminent death of her father and how it is difficult to be the only daughter left to deal with this.

**Sexual coercion:** There is a scene in the middle of the play where Sienna, in a desperate need to stay in the moment and forget about her sister's passing, tries to coerce her boyfriend Sam into having sex with her both verbally and with physical touch. There is no nudity and the moment is brief as Sam accidentally knocks something over and breaks the moment.

**Parental decline/Alzheimers:** Sienna is dealing with her father being put into a home and there is mention of him deteriorating throughout the play. We never see him - more the effects of her dealing with an ailing parent and being the sole voice looking out for him.
